2. 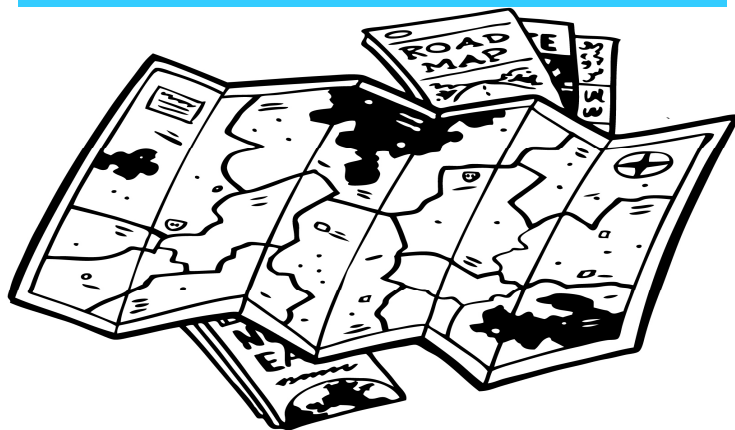

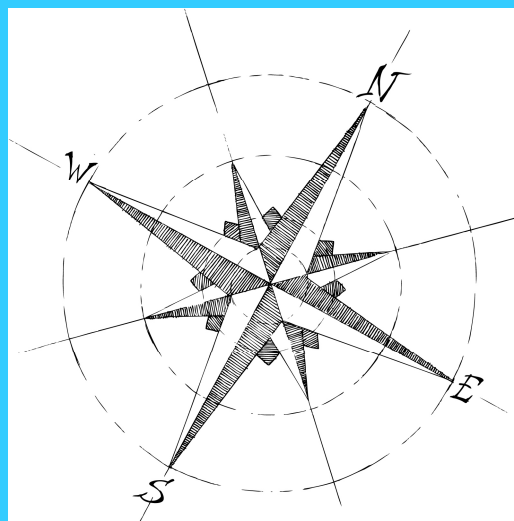
