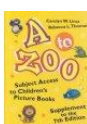

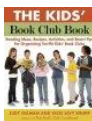

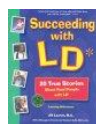
J/PT/306.874/GOL [My Mother Worked and I Turned Out Okay](#) by Katherine Wyse Goldman

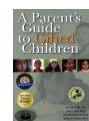
J/PT/306.89/LUM [The Stepkin Stories](#) by Peggy Lumpkin

Provides upbeat profiles of individuals of all ages who have overcome their learning differences, including children, doctors, musicians, lawyers and painters.



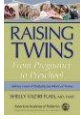

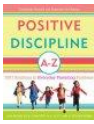
J/PT/372.5/KOH [The Big Messy Art Book](#) by MaryAnn F. Kohl

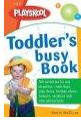
J/PT/649/FLA [Raising Twins: From Pregnancy to Preschool](#) by Shelly Vaziri Flais, M.D.
