Library Renovation to Begin in Late Fall

We are excited to announce that a planned renovation to the La Grange Public Library will begin this fall. We thank everyone who participated through surveys and focus groups. In total, over 6,900 square feet will be updated to improve service to the community.

Users will enjoy an additional 700 square feet of space, and early learning play-based opportunities will be enhanced in the youth area. The lobby will also be refreshed to make the most popular collections—movies, music, and new books—even more convenient for patrons. Additionally, after almost 10 years and 2 million visitors, worn carpeting will be replaced.

Funds have been set aside annually in the special reserve fund to complete this update. There will be no cost to taxpayers. The special reserve fund, by law, must be spent on facility improvements.

La Grange Public Library Board President, Laurie Braun, said, "We are excited about this renovation, which will make the Library an even more inviting and welcoming space for adults and children. By providing more tools and space for studying in our youth department, we can become an even more effective community partner in addressing the achievement gap among students by enhancing opportunities for all segments of our community."

Renovation is anticipated to begin in late fall 2017 and last four to six months. Library services will continue during that time. More details and plans will be available as we move forward, and we will post continual updates on lagrangelibrary.org/plenty, as well as the Library's Facebook page.


